



Summer Day Camp Parent FAQ

General Information

- 1. Q: What are the program hours and dates? How much does it cost?**
A: Camp is open Monday through Friday from 8:00am - 6:00pm. There are five sessions to pick from. You may choose your camper's actual attendance schedule; but are responsible for full tuition. Each session costs \$280.
- 2. Q: Do you offer an option for early drop-off or late pick-up?**
A: we are not able to offer early drop-off or late pick-up.
- 3. Q: Do you offer any discounts or scholarships?**
A: At this time, there are no discounts or scholarships. However, something we are offering are payment plans. Please scroll to the bottom of the Day Camp website www.TemeculaCA.gov/DayCamp under "Registration Information." There you will see the graphic regarding payment plans.
- 4. Q: What is the drop-off and pick-up process like?**
A: Drop-off will be done from the loading zone at the front of the facility. Campers and parents will stay in the vehicle upon arrival and camp staff will approach the car and check in your camper. For the pick-up process, parents will enter the Multi-purpose room to check-out their camper.
- 5. Q: Can I visit my camper or Jr. Counselor at camp?**
A: Sure! To minimize distractions to the group, we do request that visits do not exceed 10 minutes (unless other arrangements are made with camp staff). We are also happy to schedule a tour outside of camp hours. Email DayCamp@TemeculaCA.gov to request a tour.
- 6. Q: What is your sick policy? Can I get a refund if my camper is sick and missing camp?**
A: Please do not bring your camper if they are sick or have any communicable disease. At your request, we can provide a pro-rated refund or account credit based on the number of days the camper attended the program. Campers must have missed at least 5 consecutive days of camp in order to be eligible for a pro-rated refund or credit.

7. Q: What should I send with my camper?

A: Campers need to bring the following LABELED items:

- a. Lunch - keep in mind that refrigerators are not available
- b. Snacks
- c. Water bottle
- d. Towel or blanket
- e. Sunscreen
- f. Wear closed-toed shoes
- g. Swim items for swim days

Activities and Daily Life

1. Q: What activities will campers participate in? What are some examples of games and activities?

A: Examples of activities and games are: Red Light-Green Light, Simon Says, Freeze Dance, Name that Tune, Trivia, pool noodle tag, scavenger hunts, arts and crafts, and much more!

2. Q: Will campers be swimming at the facility pool this summer?

A: Yes! The swim schedule will vary, but parents will be provided plenty of notice regarding swim dates. Swimming is optional, and alternative activities will be available for campers who are not swimming.

3. Q: Will campers have access to the playground/tot lot at Ronald Reagan Sports Park?

A: Yes! Campers will be able to use the playground between the hours of 9:00am - 12:00pm.

4. Q: Will campers go on off-site field trips like museums and amusement parks?

A: Yes! Summer Day Camp participants embark on fun and exciting field trips every week! Teen camp (ages 12 – 14) will attend an additional age-appropriate field trip every Tuesday. Campers of all ages (6 – 14) will attend a field trip every Thursday. The cost of field trips is included in camp fees.
