Temecula Elections

- Incorporation to 2017
(At-Large Elections)
- 2018 and Beyond
(By-District Elections)

Election Types

At-Large - Voters of entire city elect all members to city council, there are no districts

From District – City is divided into districts, each council member resides within particular district he/she represents, and is elected by voters from entire city

By District - City is divided into districts, each council member resides within particular district he/she represents, and is elected by voters of his/her district only

Why the Change?

California Voting Rights Act

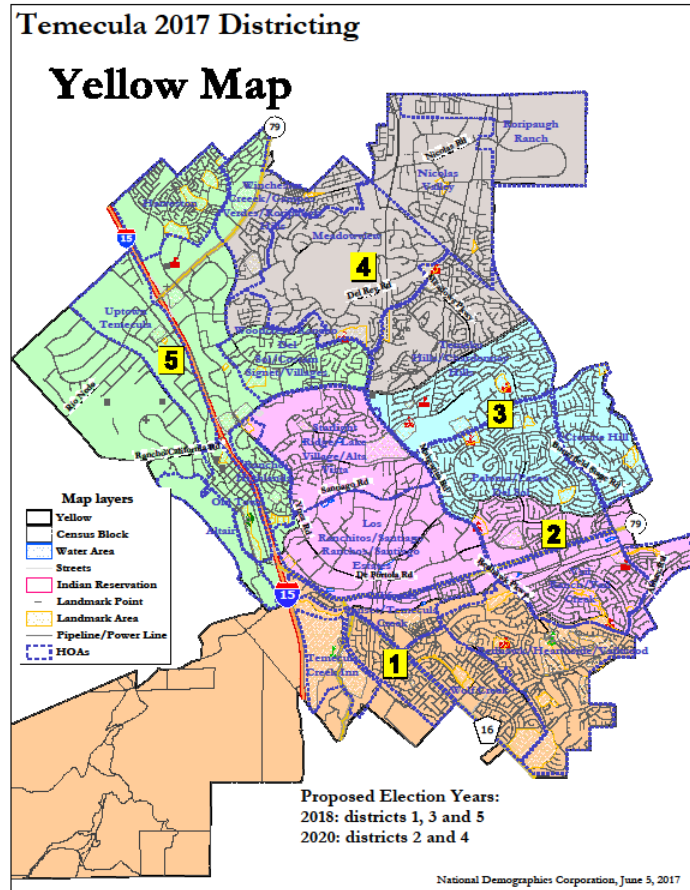
Generally speaking, prohibits at-large election system if (1) there is racially polarized voting and (2) it impairs the ability of protected class voters to elect candidates of their choice or (3) impairs their ability to influence the outcome of an election.

(Elections Code § 14027)

Districting Process

- 45 days + 90 Days
- Resolution of Intent
- Two Public Hearings Before Maps Drawn
- Maps Drawn by Demographer (Software)
- Maps Published / Public Comments
- Two Public Hearings After Maps Drawn/Publish
- Ordinance Adoption

- District 2 and 4 - November 3, 2020

Redistricting

- 2020 Census
- Public Workshops / Meetings
- New Maps for Consideration / Adoption
- 2030 Census

- Candidate Committees / Reporting
- Campaigning (social media, mailers, sign regulations, etc.)
- Candidate Forums
- October 22nd – Registration Deadline
